



Updated Illness Response Plan Quarantine Guidelines

FOR CONFIRMED EXPOSURE WITHOUT A MASK.

EXPOSED PERSON HAS NO SYMPTOMS.

CURRENT:

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>After 10 full days have passed,</u> return to school if:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Not tested for COVID-19 AND Do not experience any COVID symptoms during the quarantine period (Return on day 11 since the exposure) 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>After 7 full days have passed,</u> return to school if:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tested for COVID-19 AND Receive a negative result AND Do not experience any COVID-19 symptoms during the quarantine period <p style="color: red; text-align: center;">If student chooses to be tested to discontinue after 7 days, the test must be performed on day 5, 6, or 7 since the last exposure to the positive person.</p> <p>Must wear a mask, social distance, and monitor for symptoms through day 14</p>
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NEW ADDITIONS:

If a person is fully vaccinated for COVID-19 with an exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19, you are NOT required to quarantine if you meet all three criteria below:

- Are fully vaccinated for COVID-19 (i.e., it has been greater than 2 weeks following receipt of your second dose in a 2-dose series, or it has been greater than 2 weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine),
 - It has been less than 3 months since you were fully vaccinated,
 - Do not experience any symptoms since your current COVID-19 exposure
- Employees should continue to self-monitor for 14 days post exposure. In the event an employee becomes symptomatic, Nurse Katie should be notified immediately.

If a person has clinically recovered from COVID and has exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID:

A person who has clinically recovered from COVID-19 and then is identified as a contact of a new case within 3 months of symptom onset or first positive test of their most recent illness does not need to be quarantined.

However, if a person is identified as exposed to a new case 3 months or more after the first case symptom onset or first positive test, they should follow quarantine recommendations.
