



## Information about FPD's 2020-2021 Dining Program

### What are the prices for lunch?

Prices for hot lunches are in two tiers, based on your child's grade.

Grades 3K*-5	\$ 5.00
Grades 6-12	\$ 7.50

This price includes a meal plus a beverage. Examples of meal and beverage options indicated below. Desserts are sold separately.

Students in grades 1-12 may also choose from a variety of freshly made, pre-packaged salads and sandwiches for varying prices. Prices for these items are listed on the menu found at [www.fpdmacon.org/dining](http://www.fpdmacon.org/dining).

*\*3K option only for students staying in FPD's afterschool program.*

### What is included in my child's meal?

**Grades 3K-K:** A typical daily lunch would include a protein, two sides, including at least one vegetable, and a healthy snack.

**Grades 1 – 12:** Your child can pick from four options; three hot and one cold option.

- **Main Ingredient Station:** Fresh, delicious, from scratch entrees with appropriate sides. A sample lunch would include meatloaf, mashed potatoes, and lima beans.
- **Crossroads Station:** Fun, popular, food truck style items. A sample lunch would include hamburgers with toppings, curly fries, and steamed green beans.
- **Mangia! Mangia!:** Delicious Mediterranean inspired cuisine. A sample lunch would include two slices of pepperoni pizza, steamed cauliflower and a tossed salad.
- **Transit Fare:** Freshly made grab-and-go salads (with or without protein), selected sandwiches, bottled drinks, desserts and a selection of pre-packaged chips. **Transit Fare items are sold separately at varying prices.**

*Note: Minimum protein portion sizes range from a minimum of 2 oz (grades 3K-K), to 3 oz (grades 1-5), to 6 oz (grades 6-12).*

### **Beverages:**

Your child has a choice of beverage.

**3K-K:** Milk, juice or water

**1-5:** Milk, juice or water

**6-12:** Fountain drink, lemonade, tea, milk, juice or water.

Students in grades 6-12 may also purchase from a selection of bottled drinks for \$1.

## **How is lunch being served?**

Your child can enjoy a FPD lunch on any day that you choose for him/her.

- **Grades 3K-K** – Parents will soon receive log-in information to see the daily options for lunch and order a meal. There will be a cutoff of midnight day before. Your child's lunch will be delivered to his/her classroom.
- **Grades 1-5** – Students select their lunch in Dining Hall, choosing from the menu options available on that day. Charges will be assessed and posted to the family's FPD Smart tuition billing statement.
- **Grades 6-12** – Students select their lunches in Dining Hall, choosing from the menu options available and use their school IDs to purchase their daily lunch. Charges will be assessed and posted to the family's FPD Smart Tuition billing statement.

## **What's on the menu?**

Monthly menus for all grades are posted at [www.fpdmacon.org/dining](http://www.fpdmacon.org/dining). For lower grades especially, please review the menu with your child to assist him/her in making a choice for lunch.

## **How are dining fees assessed?**

Lunches are served and billed on an a la carte basis. Dining fees are billed based on the meals that their child(ren) purchase daily, and will be posted to the family's FPD student billing account.

## **Can I put spending boundaries on my child?**

## **Will I be billed for lunch if my child is absent or doesn't each lunch?**

A'La Carte dining provides a simple form of billing and payment: if your child is on campus and purchases meals/snacks it will be billed to your FPD Smart billing account. If your student is absent or if he/she doesn't purchase any lunch items that day, there will be no charge to you.

## **May I eat with my child in the Dining Hall?**

Dining with your child on-campus is discouraged at this time, due to COVID compliance and limited seating. We hope to restore parent-child dining in the near future.

## **What safety precautions are being taken with lunch?**

The following measures are some of the steps being taken to protect your child during his/her FPD lunch.

- Students will enter the Dining Hall, masked and socially distancing.
- FPD staff will be strategically placed throughout the Dining Hall, monitoring safety protocols.
- Seat counts at each table have been reduced from 8 to 4, this allowing for continued social distancing as students eat lunch. Students in 1st – 5th will remain with their Viking Squads.
- SAGE staff are required to wear PPE such as masks, hairnets, hats and single use disposable gloves.
- Dining Director, Jonas Smith, will be taking staff temperatures daily before entering the kitchen. All dining staff will be held to the same standards established by FPD COVID safety response.

## **What if my child (grades 6-12) loses his student ID?**

Students in grades 6-12 are issued student ID cards that serve multiple purposes.

- Restricted building access
- Dining purchases
- Media center check out

Students are asked to protect their student ID cards, as the cost of a replacement card is \$25, which covers the cost of the card, and the multiple programming changes that are required to facilitate a new card.

If your child requires a replacement card, instruct him/her to see Cindy Martin in the FPD business office. The \$25 card replacement fee will be charged to your FPD Smart billing account.

## **What if my child (grades 6-12) forgets his student ID?**

Your child can still enjoy lunch at FPD! A student who forgets his/her student ID is instructed to tell the SAGE cashier his/her first or last name, or his/her PIN number associated with their student ID.
