

## 2024 Summer Reading Assignment | World Literature

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### **Why do we have a summer reading assignment?**

The key to being a great reader and a great writer is like riding a bike – it takes practice. It also takes exposure. How can one ride a bike without first seeing how it is done? Reading is not something we want you to do just during the school year; life-long learners are also life-long readers. Summer also provides time to enjoy uninterrupted reading and allows students to digest ideas prior to discussing and interpreting ideas in class.

### **The Novel**

*The Last Battle* by C.S Lewis. Any edition.

### **Why has my teacher chosen this novel?**

English 10 is a world literature curriculum; *The Last Battle* is the final installment in the famous *Chronicles of Narnia* fantasy series, which details the adventures of both humans and mythical creatures in a parallel world that acts as an allegory for Christians. *The Last Battle* is an allegory for the end times, and what we can expect as Christians. Therefore, it sets up perfectly for Biblical Immersion that can be important for us to discuss.

### **The Assignment**

Step 1: Read and enjoy the novel!

Step 2: Annotate the Text, which will be turned in on the first day of school (details below).

Step 3: Write a *two-page* essay, which will be due on the first day of school (details below).

### **Annotations: What Do You Highlight?**

If you feel like you have no idea what/how to annotate, start here:

- What do you **notice**? What jumps out at you as you read?
- What keeps coming up **again and again**? Are there any recurring themes/symbols?
- Can you **make a prediction** about what comes next based on what just happened?
- Can you **make connections** to yourself, the world, or other books?
- Are there significant **quotes** that add meaning to the text?
- Are you noticing any **figurative language** (similes, metaphors, sensory language, etc.)

### **Essay Prompt**

Write an argumentative essay that argues for what you believe is the most central theme in the novel. **You must support your position with textual evidence.** Your essay should be written in MLA format (see link below for help) and you should not use any outside sources – novel only. *The only exception to this MAY be SOME use of biblical passages to aid in your analysis.*
